


# Bridging Cultures with Eco Learning Partners

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# What is Eco Learning Partners?

- **Partnership project linking Scottish primary schools with schools in China**
- **Combines Chinese/English learning with the context of Learning for Sustainability**
- **Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL)**
- **An opportunity for learners to share their learning with their peers**

# Objectives of Eco Learning Partners

- **Innovative and creative approach to curriculum**
- **Relevant and challenging topics**
- **Create opportunities for **real** interaction with their peers**
- **Meet CFE outcomes across the curriculum**

## How does it work?

- **Schools are partnered**
- **Teachers work together to plan learning (PL sessions provided for this)**
- **Agreed topic covered throughout the week**
- **Live link-up class to class for learners to share**
- **Chinese exchange teachers on site to facilitate live lesson**
